November 12 – I AM the True Vine (John 15:1)

Main Idea: Jesus is the vine through which redemptive history grows. Heart Change: We would meet Jesus as the true desire of our hearts.

As the final night of Jesus life continues, he shares with the disciples the last I AM statement in the book of John. Using the little time he has left with his disciples, Jesus shares with them a powerful truth about being in relationship with Jesus. Please take a moment to read John 15:1-11.

The disciples had been through a lot with Jesus over the past few years, what is the main idea of what Jesus is wanted to tell them in these last moments?

Looking at Jesus analogy of the vine, what truths can we learn about Jesus and the relationship that we have with him?

If you haven't already talked about this, why do you think Jesus used the word "abide" so much in explaining this I AM statement?

What is the difference between being results driven and fruit driven?

What would your life look like if you presented your life to Jesus with no restrictions or conditions?

- 1. If I abide in the fact that Jesus is patient and kind, what does that change about how I trust him?
- 2. If I abide in the fact that Jesus does not rejoice when I do wrong, how does that change what I do when I sin?
- 3. If I abide in the fact that Jesus bears all things, how can I depend on Jesus more fully in with my life?
